

Regulations for Rewarding Students of I-Shou University for Passing Foreign Language Proficiency Tests

- Article 1 The Regulations for Rewarding Students of I-Shou University for Passing Foreign Language Proficiency Tests (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) are made by I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) to encourage students to learn foreign languages actively, gain a competitive edge, and connect with the international community.
- Article 2 The term “foreign languages” mentioned herein refers to English, Japanese, Korean, French, German, Thai, and Vietnamese.
The term “overseas students” mentioned herein refers to students admitted to the University under the Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.
- Article 3 During the period of studying at the University, officially enrolled students (including those in post-baccalaureate programs) are eligible to apply for a reward under the Regulations after having obtained foreign language proficiency certificates. Each student is permitted to apply for the reward at each level only once and is strictly prohibited from applying for a lower level after having applied for a higher one. Overseas students and overseas Chinese students are not eligible to apply for a reward if they have taken a language proficiency test in a language that is the official language of their country of origin.
- Article 4 Application periods:
1. Applications are accepted in March and September every year. The actual application period is subject to an official announcement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the deadline for application by graduands is May 31 every year.
 2. For certificates issued between August 1 of the previous year and January 31 of the current year, reward applications are accepted in March; and for those issued between February 1 and July 31 of the current year, reward applications are accepted in September.
- Article 5 The reward scheme consists of four levels, and the criteria for each level are listed in the Appendix.
Reward amounts vary from year to year depending on the annual budget and the test results.
- Article 6 To apply for the reward, applicants shall submit the following online:
1. A student ID card or a certificate of student status;
 2. The test report;
 3. The passport and the Alien Resident Certificate (applicable to overseas students, and students from Hong Kong, Macau, and the Mainland Area); and

4. The applicant's bank account information.

Article 7 The Regulations become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In case of any disputes or misunderstandings regarding the interpretation of the language or terms of the Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
